SNOWDROPS



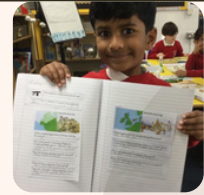
Rion for always being cheerful and doing his very best. He is a pleasure to work with.

LADYBIRDS



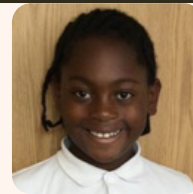
Sanjith for his exceptional knowledge and enthusiasm towards our topic on the Stone Age. Superb attitude and standard of work, well done.

BUMBLEBEES



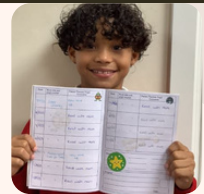
MJ for an excellent start to Year 4 writing; she is using some great vocabulary and grammar.

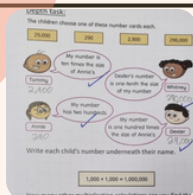
Kahari for showing determination and hard work in every subject! Keep it up, Kahari!

KINGFISHERS



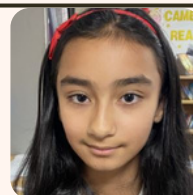
Laike for showing a great attitude to learning and working hard on showing focus in lessons. His reading diary is always up to date - well done!
